

The meaning of Liturgy....

The Church's form of divine worship, liturgy, consists of the celebration of Mass, the Sacraments, and the Divine Office, or Daily Prayer of the Church. All other liturgies flow from and toward the Eucharistic celebration, which is the foundation and pinnacle of our faith. Liturgy, in general, is the culmination of God's people, the Church, and God's Savior, Jesus Christ.

Jesus died and rose once and for all for our salvation. Through the sacred act of liturgy, the effects of his dying and rising are carried forward into the present and into the future, allowing people of all ages to experience redemption. In addition to "remembering" everything that Jesus did, the wonder of liturgy is that Jesus actually manifests and works alongside his people to accomplish what is being remembered. We remember what Jesus did at the Last Supper in the Eucharist, and Jesus is present again in the bread and wine.

The term Liturgy literally means "people's work," and it is used in the Catholic Church to describe all public acts of worship that take place, as it draws the people into God's work. It is through the liturgy that people engage with the faith and deepen their relationship with God. We encounter God and are united with our brothers and sisters all over the world as the Universal Church through the liturgy.
