Did you know this about Godparents?...

What qualifications are needed to be a godparent? A godparent ought to be a confirmed Catholic Christian who is at least sixteen years old, a devoted practitioner of the Catholic faith, and an active participant in the parish community.

What is the ideal number of godparents? It is only required by church law to have one godparent, but having two has long been customary.


Can more than one child in the same family be under the care of the same godparents? Yes, provided that they truly believe that it is their duty and goal to support the kids' spiritual development.

What gender should the godparent be? You are free to select either a male or a female godparent if you only select one. But if you want two godparents, one must be a male and the other a female.

Could someone who isn't Catholic be a godparent? If there is a legitimate Catholic sponsor who satisfies all godparent requirements, a non-Catholic who has been baptized may act as a "official witness" to the baptism. The non-Catholic who is chosen to serve as a witness ought to be an engaged and active member of his/her congregation. All the functions of a godparent during the baptism may be carried out by a non-Catholic witness. His or her name, along with the godparent's name, will be recorded in the Sacrament Record Book as a "official witness."

What distinguishes a godparent from a witness? "A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community" is how Canon (Church) Law defines a witness. A confirmed Catholic in good standing with the Church serves as a godparent.

In the event that a godparent is unable to attend the baptism ceremony, can someone else act as a stand-in godparent? A proxy can take the place of a godparent who is unable to attend the baptism service. Along with the name of the missing godparent, that person's name will be recorded in the Sacramental Record Book as a "proxy."
