What does the 10 Commandments tell us? Cont'd

VI. You shall not commit adultery.

Respecting both your own and other people's bodies is required under this commandment. Act and speak in a moderate manner. Let modesty dictate what you wear. Married individuals are likewise commanded to honor their spouses under the Sixth Commandment. It is improper for a married individual to date or begin treating a different man or woman as their spouse. Married couples should make every effort to ensure that their wedded love endures and grows.

VII. You shall not steal.

You are forbidden by the Seventh Commandment from taking or using another person's property without that person's consent. It also requests that you return any property you discover has been stolen. You must also uphold justice according to the commandment. Assuring that everyone on earth receives their fair share is something you must do.

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Lying in any form is forbidden by the Eighth Commandment. This involves exposing the facts about someone else's shortcomings and even destroying their reputation through lies. In the event that you make a mistake and say something hurtful, you have to work to undo the harm.

IX. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

This Commandment mostly applies to adults. It states that it is improper to constantly wish that the spouse of someone else were your own and to think about them constantly. Adults should cleanse their hearts if they are experiencing lust.

X. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

This commandment prohibits wishing that another person's money or possessions were your own. Develop a positive outlook on other people's blessings to help you avoid this sin. Recognize your blessings and trust that God has provided everything you require for a happy existence.
