The Our Father....

If you have been a practicing Catholic since you were a young child, you have said this prayer countless times. Saying this prayer aloud or in silence becomes second nature, just like everything else we do a lot. We must constantly remind ourselves to pause and consider the words we are speaking. Let us examine each sentence in more detail and see how we may apply this prayer to our lives.

1. Our Father, Who art in heaven - As we begin our prayer, we declare that the central idea of our faith is that God is our heavenly Father, the all-powerful, allknowing one. Observe that Jesus emphasized "Our Father" rather than "My Father" when giving us instructions. Instead of living as solitary individuals, "we experience God's fatherhood as members of the church, the family of Jesus the Son" in God's kingdom. This serves as a reminder that we should regard everyone in our vicinity as fellow children of God.

2. Hallowed be Thy Name - Another synonym for holy or sanctified is hallowed. When we pray, "hallowed be Thy name," we are not only acknowledging that God is holy; more significantly, we are pleading for the world to acknowledge God as the ultimate holy power, so that one day (hopefully sooner rather than later) everyone will acknowledge Him as the only true God, one who is powerful, righteous, and beloved by all.

3. Thy Kingdom come - This petition is meant to serve two purposes. First, we are pleading for the presence of God's kingdom—a place where only kindness, integrity, and love for one another exist-in our day-to-day existence. Second, we pray for the Lord to fulfill His promise to return at the end of time and give us eternal life.
