Fourth Sunday of Advent. . . .

The fourth Sunday of Advent marks the conclusion of our Advent season. Now that the patient (or impatient) planning and waiting are through, everything we did (or didn't do) is history. Together, we enter the Christmas season brimming up with the unfailing love of God, a love that was freely given to each and every one of us unworthy humans. Like all excellent gifts, this one was given to us so that we may give it to others.

How will we share the incredible gift of God's love for humanity this Christmas?

- Look for opportunities to perform random acts of kindness for those around you.
- Think about conversation starters you can use with strangers.
- Turn off your phone in elevators, lines, and other places where people wait.
- Say hello to your cashier or waitress by name and acknowledge him or her as a person.
- Tell someone who lights up the room that they exude Christ.
- Thank anyone you see helping another person.
- Make an effort to be friendly and nice, modeling the Father's love.
- Put someone else's needs ahead of your own without letting anyone know.

When we do any of these things, we are personally bringing the Father's love to people and living out the commandment He gave us - love one another! The more we practice sharing our love, the easier it will be to give. We won't have to force ourselves to reach out to our brothers and sisters; it will just happen. When we recognize the significance of God's love in our lives and see it as the ultimate gift we can receive, the value of that love only increases when we share it with others.
