A stroll through Christmas . . .

Christmas is one of the shortest yet most distinctive liturgical seasons in the Church. It includes additional feasts related to the revelation that Jesus is Lord of the nations, as well as the eight-day celebration of the Lord's Nativity, often known as the Christmas octave. Additionally, a number of saints have feast days, and the stories of many of them have particular relevance to the season.

Dec. 26: Feast of St. Stephen - There are a number of feast days with rich customs and history across the octave. It's fascinating to notice that December 26th, the day following Christmas, is a martyr's feast. Christians are reminded at this early point in the Christmas season of the Lord's command that everyone who chooses to follow him must pick up his cross, recalling the reason for Christ's coming and the assignment of his holy mission. One of the first martyrs in Christian history, St. Stephen, is revered as a living example of what it means to confess Christ as Savior without considering the price.

Dec. 27: Feast of St. John - St. John the evangelist and apostle has a feast day on December 27. John, who is thought to have written the Gospel, the Book of Revelation, and three New Testament letters, is regarded as the disciple who was closest to Jesus and is credited with teaching us that "God is love" (1 John 4:8). This feast has traditionally been connected to the blessing of wine because only St. John's Gospel records the miracle at the Cana wedding feast, where Jesus magically transforms water into wine.

Dec. 28: Feast of the Holy Innocents - Herod's violent wrath led to the martyrdom of the Holy Innocents on December 28, as he felt compelled to destroy any threat to his authority by executing anybody who matched the description of the unborn king he had learned about from the Magi (Mt 2:13–18). He gave the order to kill every boy in or near Bethlehem who was less than two, not wanting to take any chances with the baby's survival. The angelic warning to St. Joseph to escape to Egypt with Mary and Jesus in the middle of the night, of course, is a sign of divine intervention and the reason Christ survives. The above-mentioned Gospel preached on this day raises two primary concerns facing the Church today: immigration and abortion.

Today is the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. During our New Year may our families "grow in wisdom and have the favor of God upon them." This month, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to bring Christmas to the hearts of the poor, by assisting families in need. Thanks!
