Understanding the Apostles Creed (cont'd)...

Article 7: Article 7: From There He Will Come Again to Judge the Living and the Dead.

The Seventh Article confirms that at the end of time, Jesus Christ will return a second time to judge both the living and the dead. Known as the Day of Reckoning or Judgement Day, God will judge both the living and the dead on the Second Coming of Christ and extend His arms to His believers. In the Catholic religion, we hold that a person is immediately judged after death to see if their life will merit an ascent into Heaven. During the Second Coming, there is also a general judgment of all of God's children.

Article 8: I Believe in the Holy Spirit.

The eighth article serves as a reminder that God is triune—that is, he exists in three persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—collectively known as the Holy Trinity. While unique, each of these individuals is equally divine.

Article 9: The Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints.

We, Catholics, consider the Church to be a vital component of our life and a means of honoring God's majesty. Catholic churches are holy places where people can gather to study God's work and share His message.

Article 10: The Forgiveness of Sins.

Jesus Christ entered the world to atone for our sins by giving his life. All Catholics hold the fundamental idea that sins are forgiven. God still loves us despite the fact that we are fallible humans who will commit sin throughout our life. This forgiveness is granted to us through the Sacrament of Penance, baptism, and confession. God shows us that we can ask for forgiveness and live in His light even in the face of our misdeeds.

Article 11: The Resurrection of the Body.

The human form is a union of the soul and body according to Catholic doctrine, therefore death is but a momentary separation of the two until Christ's Second Coming, the General Judgement, and the Resurrection of the Dead. Both body and spirit shall soar to Heaven for the just and the righteous.

Article 12: And Life Everlasting.

Since humans are merely mortal, we must die, just as our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, did. To the glory of God, just as Jesus rose from the grave, so too will people. The transition from one life to the next occurs when we die. Christ assesses our souls to see if we are especially good when we die, and this happens instantly in private judgment. God will allow us to enter Heaven even though we have sinned as long as we confess our religion, ask for pardon, and lead moral lives.

The Apostles' Creed serves as a reminder to Catholics of fundamental beliefs within their religion and provides clarification on scriptural discoveries about Christ and His role in our redemption.
