What is a well-formed conscience?

The development of a sound conscience is yet another essential component of Christian moral instruction. "Conscience is a judgment of reason by which the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act" (CCC, no. 1796). "Man has in his heart a law inscribed by God. . . . His conscience is man's most secret core, and his sanctuary" (GS, no. 16).

A yearning for happiness is inborn in all people. Choosing well and growing in one's relationship with God fulfill this desire. Every person is called to have a correct conscience since conscience judgment is essential to making moral decisions.

Respecting one's conscience requires adherence to a set of guidelines. First, always act with conscience. Second, if at all feasible, a mistaken conscience needs to be adjusted. Third, avoid acting in a way that raises ethical questions. We must constantly heed the specific recommendations made by our conscience, even though we are aware that it is not always appropriate or good to follow its own advice. This might occur from ignorance, whereby we lacked the necessary information to make an informed decision without any fault of our own.

But we also have to acknowledge that ignorance and mistakes are not always innocent; this is the case, for instance, when we failed to look for the information we required in order to properly construct our conscience. As we must follow our conscience, we also bear a heavy burden to ensure that it is shaped in a way that upholds the real moral good.
