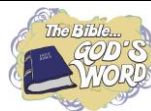
PASTOR'S CORNER

Mass Etiquette: Things to Do and Not Do in Mass cont'd . . .

6. Dress modestly and appropriately. Sunday best should be worn. Catholics hold that during every Mass, God descends to earth to greet us. Therefore, why wouldn't we dress up?

7. Show up at least a few minutes early. If for whatever reason you are unable to arrive on time, try to sit toward the back so as not to bother others. You can pray and properly readjust yourself for Mass if you arrive at Mass early.

8. Cell phones should never be used in Mass for calls or texting. The only exceptions are major emergencies—not minor ones—and if you need to use one, kindly leave the church before doing so. Additionally, if you use your phone for readings or prayers, it is acceptable, but try to be inconspicuous.

9. Don't sit on the edge of the pew if you sit down before others. Sit in the center so others won't have to climb over you. Men, please offer your seats to any women (elderly, crippled, etc.) who must stand if the church is crowded.

10. When we enter and leave Church, genuflect toward the Tabernacle. Christ is here for our benefit. We confess that He is our Lord and God by letting our right knee touch the ground. A bow is sufficient if someone is physically unable to genuflect. If you approach the altar or tabernacle during Mass, bow respectfully.

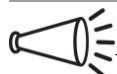
