The Scrutinies....

The Elect, or those undergoing the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), are prepared for entry into the Catholic Church through three unique ceremonies known as the Scrutinies. Nearing the end of RCIA formation, they occur during the Purification and Enlightenment stage. In the souls of the Elect, the Scrutinies are meant "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful" and "strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good." (Quotes from the Ritual Text #141 for the Adult Rite of Christian Initiation)

While the word "scrutinize" has a harsh and scary connotation, its actual definition is "to see clearly or inspect closely." Understanding sin in its proper context and how it affects us is the goal of the Scrutinies. They also speak to the transforming healing that Christ may provide for us when He extends Himself to us.

On the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, the Scrutinies are linked to three distinct Gospel narratives: **the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well**, where He offers Himself as the Living Water; **the healing of the blind man**, where He gives Himself as the Light of the World; and **the raising of Lazarus from the dead**, where He reveals Himself as the Resurrection and the Life.

In every Scrutiny, we see the wonder of a transformative experience with Christ, who redeems in tender love. Consider the following while you observe the Scrutinies this Lent: What needs to be strengthened in my heart and soul? Decide to go to Confession, ask for God's healing grace, and diligently work on those areas of your spiritual life. We can choose to follow Christ and not stay in the dark since He has set us free.
